Plot them on a line graph and create 5 questions/answers whereby you to interpret the graph.</p>	<p>Using inspiration from your art lesson and your landscape paintings, create a collage depicting the landscape. You could include Shackleton's ship 'Endurance.' Use any materials you like</p>	<p>Create your own word search, using words linking to Shackleton's journey</p>	<p>Write a Play script... A day in the life of a crew member. (or any title)</p>
